





Ralph C. Folkerts, 82, of Cumming, GA, passed away on February 28, 2023. He was a member of the fall pledge class of 1959. Fraternity brother, Jim Blankenburg, introduced Ralph to Jim's sister, Shirley; they married on October 31, 1964. Ralph graduated from the University of Illinois with studies in Mathematics and Finance. He spent the majority of his career working for State Farm in Springfield, IL where he excelled as an insurance agent. carrying an ever-present smile and a positive attitude everywhere he went. Ralph was always active in the Lutheran community, serving in key roles of congregations he worshiped in and holding many offices in Beta Sigma Psi National Lutheran Fraternity, including President of the fraternity. Ralph was instrumental in helping to create the Beta Sigma Psi Educational Foundation. He was also the director of the Beta

Sigma Psi (Housing) Foundation and served as the Vice-Chairman of the foundation for many years. He received the Lienemann Award—the fraternity's highest honor—for his many years of service and lifelong dedication to the fraternity.

Noel K. Manhart, 68, of Strasburg, IL, passed away on February 17, 2023. He was a member of the spring pledge class of 1973. Noel began working at the Manhart Dairy Farm and retired as the Manager of Mail List Services at World Color Press in Effingham, IL. Noel was a member of St. Paul Lutheran Church in Strasburg, IL, and served as the caretaker for St. Paul Cemetery for many years. He enjoyed singing in the Coles County Barbershop Chorus, bird watching, mushroom hunting, storytelling, listening to all types of music and watching the Chicago Cubs and Fighting Illini.

Richard L Hochleutner, 79, passed away on December 1, 2022. He was a member of the spring pledge class of 1963. Richard played football at the University of Illinois and, in his senior year, played in the 1964 Rose Bowl in which the Illini defeated the University of Washington. Richard spent his career working in the automotive parts industry; he was National Sales Manager for Schumacher Electric Corporation and Carrand International and later established his own agency, RH Marketing, in 1994, which served Southern California and Baja California (Mexico). Richard was, above all, a family man, a loving husband and wonderful father, and served as a cubmaster and little league coach.

Peter W. Sauer PhD, 76, of Urbana, IL, passed away on December 27, 2022. He was a member of Eta Chapter, graduating from the University of Missouri at Rolla in 1969 with a degree in Electrical Engineering. From 1969 to 1973, he was an electrical engineer for the United States Air Force (he eventually reached the rank of Lieutenant Colonel). He then obtained his master's and doctoral degrees in Electrical Engineering from Purdue University in 1974 and 1977 respectively. After graduation, Pete joined the faculty at the University of Illinois to teach courses and direct research on power systems and electric machines. He served as Academic Advisor for Alpha chapter in the late 70s and 80s. He retired in January of 2020 after over forty years of service to the university. At the time of his passing, Pete was the Grainger Chair Emeritus in Electrical Engineering, and a holder of the IEEE Lifetime Achievement Award. He also held various offices at Trinity Lutheran Church in Urbana.

Recently I've Been Into: I've been an avid runner since high school, and just ran in the 127th Boston Marathon. It was my 2nd time running Boston and 12th marathon overall. What makes Boston special is that it's the one marathon where nearly all of the 30k participants have to qualify (which took me 6 years to do!), and usually around 500k fans show up to line the whole 26.2 mile course and cheer you on along the way. It's held on a holiday weekend in Massachusetts and truly is the main event going on in town that weekend; in addition, it owns the top spot in the running world as the oldest and most prestigious marathon. I was thrilled to get to do it again, and made some adjustments in my training



this year to shave 3.5 minutes off of my 2022 finishing time (clocking in at 3:01:19). I ran a new personal best of 2:57:42 in Columbus, Ohio last year, and am signed up to run the Chicago Marathon in October.

My wife (who also has 2 music degrees) and I still try to play saxophone together & with friends when we can, and during the pandemic (when everyone was looking for a new hobby!) I worked on refreshing my German language skills that had deteriorated after high school. This culminated in an amazing trip to Germany last summer where we got to visit a lot of cool places and immerse in the culture (and of course, speak a lot of German).

Most fond memory of Beta Sig: It's tough to pick just one, so some of the top memories were our summer trips to Kane County Cougars games (including a kingly BBQ feast at Alex Johnson's house), playing pong and/or video games in the basement, Super Bowl parties and barbecues at the house, and our brief but glorious foray into intramural broomball.

If you can recall, why did you join Beta Sig: I'm a legacy and as a kid enjoyed meeting some of my dad's fraternity brothers (my godfather is a Beta Sig too!), so when it was finally time to rush I was already leaning toward joining. I don't remember exactly what Jason Braun's final recruiting sales pitch was, but it was compelling enough to seal the deal!

Why should young men join Beta Sig: Beta Sig provides a home away from home and a great base to center yourself during your years on campus. Especially at a huge institution like those in the Big Ten, having a smaller, more tightly-knit community of peers that share in your college experiences is vitally important, and one made up of brothers who share a similar religious conviction is a great place to start.

You can tell someone has been doing something for a long time when you ask him, "So tell me, Dale... how long have you been the Publications Director?" and his response is, "Well... to be honest... I don't know. I lost track." Here's Dale's story.

"I was, what you would call, a late bloomer. In the house, I had only one office, Financial Secretary. After graduation, I would always come back for the Homecoming weekend. After a while, I was Homecoming Director for a term or two. And then after another while, I was Publications Director for the recent long period."

When asked about his experience as the man behind the Alpha Newsletter, Dale said, "It was fun keeping up with so many Beta Sigs throughout the years and getting occasional calls from older Alums with bits of information or to ask a question. For each



edition, I enjoyed receiving the various articles and shaping them so that the Newsletter would look as professional as possible."

While it's unknown to Dale how long he served as the publications director, he does happen to know how many years he served as the Village Engineer of Oak Brook, IL: 35 ¹/₂.

"After graduation I worked for a small consulting civil engineering firm for 2 years. Then I changed jobs and became a civil engineer for the Village of Oak Brook," Dale said. "Coincidentally, I was interviewed and hired for both positions by the same person, Chuck Littleton. In 1972, he was the VP of the consulting firm and came to Champaign for interviews. In

1974, he changed jobs and became the Village Engineer at Oak Brook. He then left Oak Brook in 1978 and I became the Village Engineer, which I held until retirement in 2009."

Given his involvement in the fraternity and his accomplishments in his career—among many other things—Dale was awarded the Distinguished Alumni Award in 2013.

Just as he retired from his professional career in 2009, though, last fall, Dale decided to retire from his Beta Sig career as the Publications Director and pass the torch—or should we say, the stacks and stacks of newsletters he's written—onto the next guy.

"As with all things, time passes and technology got way beyond me. It was time for someone younger to take over."

Now, Dale spends time walking, reading, going to the family cabin in Wisconsin, boating, woodworking, and visiting kids and grandkids. He also attends the "Old Farts Lunch" which he helped spearhead with other Beta Sigs in the western suburbs of Chicago which, "by the way, we meet the first Thursday of each month at various restaurants in Schaumburg, IL if anyone is interested."

But when asked what his favorite part of retirement was, Dale had no hesitation: "Naps after lunch!" I'd say you've earned a few of those, Dale!
