Alpha Chapter Update – "It's Go Time" (report written by Dan Ross)

Many of you have been following the challenges faced by our Fraternity over the past several months by participating in our zoom meetings, reading the newsletters, and reaching out by email, text, and phone calls. Thank you to all of you for your prayers, financial support, words of encouragement and elbow grease when needed. For those of you that are new to what the chapter has been facing, here is a brief recap...

Going into Covid, the house was experiencing significant success, with robust membership and growing cash reserves. Since the time of Covid, our house as well as many other chapters on campus, have seen a significant decline in membership. The last numbers I heard had the entire fraternity system down by a third since 2020. The reduced



membership has had a very material negative impact on the finances of both the active and alumni chapters. It is anticipated that, barring a robust 2024/25 recruitment effort, we could be facing insolvency at the end of the next school year. There have been several efforts underway to stave off this situation, including:

1. Scholarships for Recruitment – The active and alumni chapters have been working diligently to plan for the upcoming scholarship efforts. There are several enhancements made for the onsite scholarship weekend, including several moms of active members' attending to help facilitate discussions with the parents of perspective members and focused presentations on life in the dorms versus life in the house. Thanks to Josh Baggett and the actives for helping to plan this important event for our future. In addition, a group of brothers, led by our Housing Director, Andrew Elders, just returned from a work weekend to help make the house look its best for the visit. A plan is being finalized to increase the number and size of scholarships available to this group of recruits as an additional incentive to get them to join. I am pleased to report that the actives also scheduled a recruit only weekend for the weekend after the scholarship visits, to help give the recruits a better flavor for fraternity life.

- 2. **Home Improvements** In addition to the work done to prep the house for scholarship weekend, Andrew Elders has been working with various alums and actives to curate a list of improvements that need to be made to the house, both long term and short term. The house is our asset, and we must do everything we can to care for it.
- 3. **Charitable Funding** We have been working with the national chapter on ways to access and collect additional funds for the house. We have a scholarship fund which will be used to augment the items in number 1 above, but we also can use those dollars for repairs and maintenance to the academic components of the chapter house. We will be making some announcements on ways to give in a tax favorable manner.
- 4. **Communications** Members of our alumni board, along with a team of alumni, have been working on finding our lost brethren. The more people we can keep in the know, the more good we can do to keep our fraternity alive.

So, this is make or break time for us, and I am asking for your help. There are a number of things you can do, but I will ask you, first and foremost, to pray for our fraternity. If you are like me, I have been woefully uninvolved in something that was such an important part of my life and where I am today. I cannot stand the thought of it not being around for generations to come. Second, please be on the lookout for any potential recruits. If there are young men you know that are already at Illinois or are planning on attending, please reach out to our Recruitment Chair, Mike Schwingbeck, and give him their info. Third, an operating gift would be greatly appreciated. These gifts are not tax deductible, but they are extremely helpful. If you are interested, please contact Greg Treichler.

I remain very optimistic about this fall. There is a tremendous amount of energy around fall recruitment for both the actives and alumni, and I truly believe we are giving it everything we can. Brother *Eldon T. Ahner*, 89, of New Baden, IL passed away on April 28, 2024. Eldon attended the U of I where he pursued studies in Floriculture and was a member of Beta Sigma Psi. In 1999, Eldon retired as the fourth-generation owner of Ahner Florist in New Baden. He loved growing geraniums in clay pots. He enjoyed watching anything grow. He loved cutting grass and working in his stained glass studio in the greenhouse. He served for many years as a school bus driver for the Mascoutah School District, and was still serving as an aide at the time of this death. He volunteered his time at the Mascoutah Senior Center, serving two days a week. When asked, he

would say that his favorite color was plaid. Eldon was one of the twenty-five charter members of Alpha Chapter in 1955.



Brother *Dean A. Voelker*, 60, passed away on March 11, 2024 in Mishawaka, IN. He graduated in 1982 from Metro-East Lutheran High School before attending the University of Illinois - Champaign, where he earned a degree in Architecture in 1986 and was a member of the Beta Sigma Psi Fraternity. Dean worked a variety of jobs throughout his lifetime: selling books door-to-door in college, managing a Rent-A-Center, becoming a financial advisor for Edwards Jones, and finally a Certified Senior Advisor and independent business owner selling health insurance plans. He was an avid sports fan – especially Illini football and basketball. More than anything, Dean believed in

On Saturday, April 20th, we hosted the annual **College Preparation Seminar and Christian Leadership Scholarship** interviews with **19 incoming UIUC freshmen** and 33 parents in attendance. The full day event included a meet and greet networking opportunity for the incoming students to connect with active chapter members and alumni, tours of the chapter house were given to show all of the amenities of Beta Sig, and each scholarship candidate was interviewed by the alumni scholarship committee. Active chapter members and alumni also lead the incoming students on personalized campus tours showcasing points of interest, study spots, and buildings/classrooms that will be relevant to freshman year and specific major paths - one tour focused on business/LAS majors and one tour focused on Engineering majors. The event concluded back at the chapter house with a short presentation by Pastor Schuermann of University Lutheran on his on-campus ministry and partnership with Alpha Chapter. This year's event established many solid connections between the active chapter members and incoming freshmen who the actives are optimistic will lead to membership bids and housing contract commitments.

The alumni scholarship aims to announce the recipient of the \$3000 Christian Leadership Scholarship on May 16th. The alumni scholarship committee would like to extend thanks to the active chapter for their preparation of the house and their enthusiastic engagement. Also special thanks to the mothers of Johnny Powell and Nic Talley—Karen Powell and Lisa Talley—who provided a parental perspective on Beta Sig and Alpha alumni—Alex Johnson, Nick Schwingbeck, Joe Baldwin, Erik Steinbrenner, Nathaniel Stoll, Avery Clark, Dave Wu, and

Michael Bengston—who shared their experiences in the house with the students and parents. Through everyone's efforts on scholarship weekend—in addition to an overnight open house hosted by the actives—**5 quality** freshmen have been added to the in-house roster for the Fall 2024 semester! This is a record year for our scholarship, and with additional PNMs interested in joining, the active chapter is looking to carry this momentum into Fall Rush 2024.

Strength in Numbers – Alumni Database (report written by Nathaniel Stoll)

The cheapest, fastest, easiest way for us to communicate information to the greater Alpha Alumni Chapter is... via email. And unfortunately... our database is missing a lot of email addresses... Following the Summer 2023 Alpha Alumni newsletter, our alumni database showed ~630 living members on record. Out of those members, only 243 had emails associated with them. That represents only 38% of our alumni membership.

At our homecoming meeting last year, we, as a board, were discussing the possibility of having to sell the house. Thinking about the number of men—literally, hundreds and multiple generations of Beta Sigs—who lived at 706 W Ohio St and how many memories are stored in that house, we felt the need to broaden the audience of our conversation to include as many alums as possible. Thus, we recognized a need to improve our alumni database.

So, **starting in November 2023, an effort was kicked off** to start filling the gaps in our database. First, a spreadsheet was sent out to all alumni (for whom we had email addresses) listing all brothers who were missing email address info. From this, 13 emails were added. Then, starting in January 2024, we gained some volunteering horsepower. A number of alumni—including, but not limited to, Bill Weber, Del Karmeier, Lloyd Karmeier, Alex Johnson, and board members Dan Ross, Andrew Elders, Joe Baldwin, and Josh Baggett—reached out to brothers from different decades. In conjunction with this, brothers Joe Bateman and Mark Toledano and board member

Avery Clark attended weekly meetings to assist with tracking progress and coming up with ideas to further optimize our efforts. Invitations to connect were made on social media. Emails were sent out. Text messages were sent out. Phone calls were made. And as an overall result, **113 emails were added** and **corrections/updates were made to over 180 members' info**! An awesome accomplishment from the team! Fantastic work!


