


Chapter House Improvements - Summer and Fall 2025 *(report written by Andrew Elders)*

Summer and fall brought more substantial changes to our chapter house, both expected and unexpected. Some long-term punchlist items were addressed, such as having the driveway and parking lot sealed and restriped, and painting the wrought iron railings of the front porch. Those, along with the rebuilt moat, made for a notable improvement to the outward appearance to the house. Many alumni who visited at Homecoming commented that it's the best they've seen the house look in a number of years, so we're very proud of that!

Unexpectedly, I was able to secure the donation of new lounge furniture to replace the worn-out pieces that didn't show the room (or house) to its best advantage. The donation of 10 brand-new, matching sofa-sleepers from manufacturer Charter Furniture prompted the project. A good friend of mine heads up their finance department and arranged the donation to us at no cost other than shipping fees. As they are designed and built for hotel use, they are good and sturdy and






should last us for a number of years. And being sofa-sleepers, they were put to good use when Alpha hosted two chapter walk-outs this fall. When they arrived in June, alumni Max Daichendt, Nic Talley, Dave Wu, and Galvin McQuellon helped me get them into the house and dispose of the old couches (that fell apart as we moved them!)

Of course, the addition of nice, new furniture made the old accessories look worse by comparison. New side tables that can double as lap desks were donated, as was a black marble coffee table with iron legs that should stand up to the wear the guys put on it. To replace the heavy, stationary AV cabinet that sat in front of the French doors to the west stoop, I found a new mobile AV station that accommodates the gaming systems and projector the active have come to rely on. It is much smaller and on casters that will allow for easier stoop access when needed in addition to letting more

light into the room. To cover some damaged areas in the floor, a 12x18 rug was procured and its colors serve to tie in the various elements in the room. Finally, I was able to buy and have framed 3 vintage watercolor prints of campus from 1970, corresponding with our first full year in the house.

These new furnishings will make the living situation more comfortable for the guys, and serve as a good rush tool because who wants to join a house with crummy furniture? All in all, the public spaces of the house are up to snuff for a number of years to come.


come in such a short amount of time. I can confidently assure all of you that we are in great hands going forward.

Steven Broquist Outstanding Active Award

Named in honor of Steven Broquist, an alumnus of the Alpha Chapter from the Fall 1962 Pledge Class, who served as chapter president, battalion commander of the UIUC NROTC battalion, president of the Lutheran Student Foundation, and a varsity member of both the Illinois Track and Cross Country teams as an active. Lt. Broquist sacrificed his life in the line of duty while serving in the US Marine Corps on May 14th, 1967, in South Vietnam. For his valor and selflessness, he was posthumously decorated with the Silver Star by order of President Lyndon B. Johnson.



Recently I've Been Into: Running marathons, sports photography, and traveling around the country spectating at cross country meets.







Most fond memory of Beta Sig: A feeling of belonging.
